




Until the evening of 4 October 1957, the US President, Dwight D. Eisenhower, was confident that he led the world's greatest nation. In the USA, the early 1950's are known as the Eisenhower years. A._____. The USA was the richest nation in the world and it was going richer all the time. Almost every American could hope to own a house and a car. As a general, Eisenhower had led US armed forces to victory in the Second World War and, until that evening in 1957, it seemed that no other nation could threaten the USA.

But then some news arrived that shook America's belief in itself: "The Russians are in space!" Until this moment Americans believed that their nation was the most powerful on Earth. But now the Soviet Union had gone beyond the Earth. Millions of radios all over the world could hear a new broadcast: "Beep...beep...beep..." **B**.____, the first object placed in space by humans.
