Agatha Christie was born in 1890 in Devon, England. She was the youngest child of an American father and an English mother. Her father died when she was eleven and the young Agatha became very close to her mother. She was educated at home in a house full of books. As a young woman, Agatha was described as tall with reddish-gold hair, fun and bright company, although shy at times. She married Lieutenant Archibald Christie in 1914 and in 1919, gave birth to her only child, Rosalind. They divorced in 1928. Two years before, following the death of her mother, Agatha completely disappeared for ten days, adding real life mystery to fact. She married again in 1930. She had a phenomenal literary career as a writer of crime stories. She published 66 novels, 154 short stories and 20 plays. Her book sales are only higher than the Bible and the works of Shakespeare. In 1971, she was awarded England's highest honour, the Order of the British Empire. She died in January 1976, and is buried in the churchyard in Cholsey, Oxfordshire, near where she lived.
